

## Automated Red Light Enforcement (ARLE) Funding Program *Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT)*

Approximately \$12 million is available through the ARLE Program for local governments, planning organizations, and Commonwealth agencies. Funds may be used for a range of safety and mobility projects, including roadway safety, mobility, and capacity upgrades; bicycle and pedestrian improvements; local technical assistance programs; and traffic signal improvements.

- Award Amount: No minimum or maximum stated  
Required Match: None  
Applications Due: **Thursday, July 1, 2021**

## North American Wetlands Conservation Act (NAWCA) - U.S. Standard Grants *U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS)*

The U.S. Standard Grants Program supports public-private partnerships carrying out projects involving long-term protection, restoration, and/or enhancement of wetlands and associated uplands habitats. Applicants are encouraged to partner with other organizations and individuals.

- Award Amount: \$100,000 to \$1 million  
Required Match: 50%  
Applications Due: **Friday, July 9, 2021**

## Multimodal Transportation Fund *Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED)*

The Multimodal Transportation Fund provides grants to encourage economic development and ensure a safe and reliable system of transportation is available to residents of the commonwealth. Funds may be used for the development, rehabilitation, and enhancement of transportation assets in existing communities, including streetscape, lighting, sidewalks, pedestrian safety, connectivity of transportation assets, and transit-oriented projects.

- Award Amount: \$3 million maximum  
Required Match: 30%  
Applications Due: **Saturday, July 31, 2021**

## AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN (ARP)

In Pennsylvania, the Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) has been designated by the Governor as the lead Commonwealth agency to disburse funds to non-entitlement units (NEUs) of local government. DCED strongly encourages NEUs to submit their application to receive ARP funds as soon as possible. If you haven't already done so, please apply ASAP - [Single Application for Assistance](#).

We continue to monitor guidance provided by DCED and the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors (PSATS) and are here to help guide you through the process.

In order to apply for federal grants, cooperative agreements, or other forms of federal financial assistance through grants.gov, applicants must be registered and active in the System for Award Management (SAM) **before** you can submit an application. This process may take from four to six weeks. Oftentimes grant opportunities are released with a lead time of two months, sometimes less. So, now is the time to apply and be ready when the right funding opportunity comes out.
