

## South Mountain Partnership Mini-Grant Program

*Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources*

Funding is available for projects that further the goals of the Partnership, and to advance the capacity of partners to complete projects throughout the region. The Program provides funding, on a competitive basis, to projects that sustain the South Mountain landscape's sense of place by protecting and promoting the region's landscape resources.

<b>Award Amount:</b>	\$2,500 to \$15,000
<b>Required Match:</b>	1:1 match (cash or in-kind)
<b>Pre-Applications Due:</b>	<i>Friday, May 27, 2022</i>
<b>Final Applications Due:</b>	<i>Friday, July 29, 2022</i>

## North American Wetlands Conservation Act (NAWCA) Grants: U.S. Standard

*U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service*

Funding is available to support public-private partnerships carrying out projects in the United States that further the goals of NAWCA. These projects must involve long-term protection, restoration, and/or enhancement of wetlands and associated uplands habitats for the benefit of all wetlands-associated migratory birds.

<b>Award Amount:</b>	No stated minimum or maximum
<b>Required Match:</b>	No less than a 1:1 ratio
<b>Applications Due:</b>	<i>Friday, July 8, 2022</i>

## Multimodal Transportation Fund

*Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development*

Funding is available to encourage economic development and ensure that a safe and reliable system of transportation is available to the residents of the commonwealth. Funds may be used for the development, rehabilitation, and enhancement of transportation assets to existing communities; streetscape, lighting, and sidewalk enhancement; pedestrian safety; connectivity of transportation assets; and transit-oriented development.

<b>Award Amount:</b>	Not to exceed \$3 million for any project
<b>Required Match:</b>	Encouraged, but may not be required
<b>Applications Due:</b>	<i>Sunday, July 31, 2022</i>

## ARP ANNUAL REPORTS DUE APRIL 30, 2022

The U.S. Department of the Treasury Ruling requires Non-Entitlement Units that receive funding from the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) Program, a part of the American Rescue Plan (ARP), to file annual reports.
