

Dauphin County Local Share Municipal Grant Program *Dauphin County Gaming Advisory Board*

The Local Share Municipal Grant Program helps distribute funds generated by gaming to local governments for projects that support and enhance community and economic well-being and mitigate the impact of gaming and related activities. ***Pre-application conferences are strongly encouraged before August 1, 2022, but must occur no later than August 31, 2022.***

- Award Amount:** Municipal applicants - \$150,000 maximum
Non-municipal applicants - \$75,000
- Required Match:** None stated
- Applications Due:** *Thursday, September 1, 2022 - 4:30 PM*

Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act Program *U.S. Environmental Protection Agency*

Funding is available for programs covered under the Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (WIFIA) program, a federal credit program for eligible water and wastewater infrastructure projects. This year's funding will provide up to \$5.5 billion in funding to support \$11 billion in water infrastructure investment. In addition, up to \$1 billion in credit assistance is available to support \$2 billion in water infrastructure through the State infrastructure financing authority WIFIA (SWIFIA) program.

- Award Amount:** Not to exceed 49 percent of eligible project costs
- Required Match:** Balance of project costs
- Applications Due:** *Rolling basis starting September 6, 2022*

Safe Streets and Roads for All Grant Program *U.S. Department of Transportation*

The Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant program provides funds to support planning, infrastructure, behavioral, and operational initiatives to prevent death and serious injury on roads and streets involving all roadway users, including but not limited to pedestrians, bicyclists, public transportation, motorists, and commercial vehicle operators. This program is open to counties, cities, towns, townships, transit agencies, or other special districts; federally-recognized Native American Tribal governments; metropolitan planning organizations; and multijurisdictional groups comprised of eligible entities.

- Award Amount:** Action Plan Grants: \$200,000 - \$5 million
Implementation Grants: \$3 million - \$5 million
- Required Match:** At least 20 percent of eligible activity costs
- Applications Due:** *Thursday, September 15, 2022 - 5:00 PM EDT*
